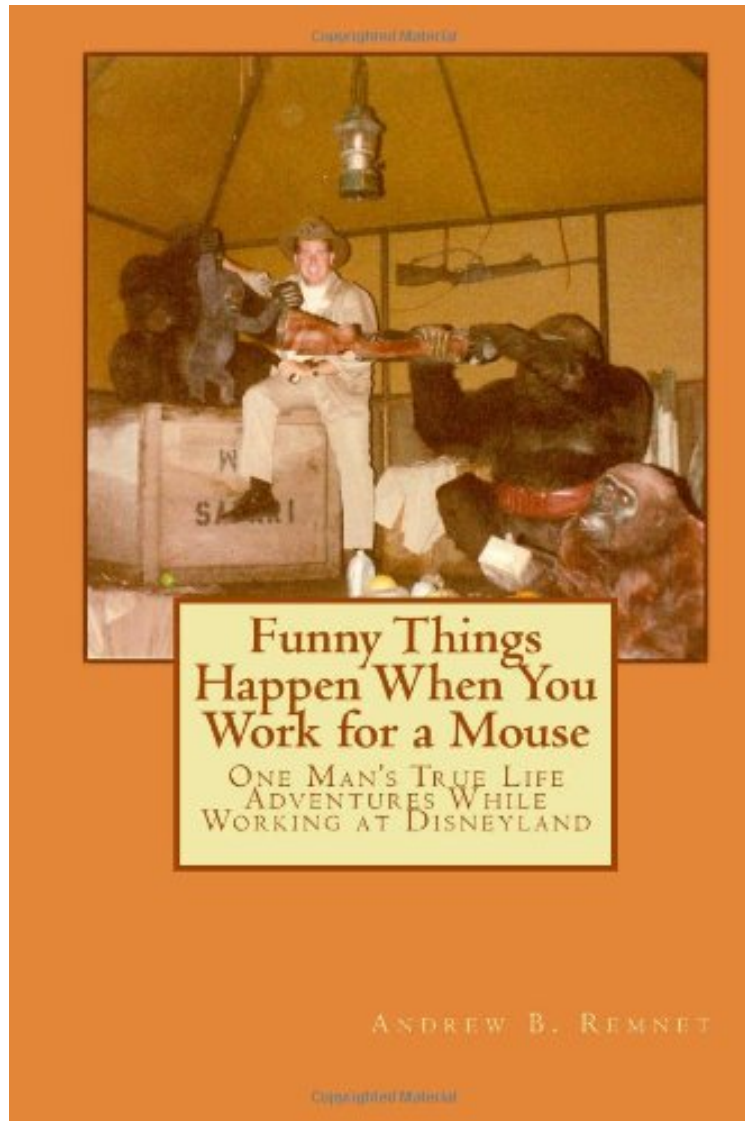

but this book was really underwhelming. It's extremely short, about 70 pages, with a lot of grammar errors. It reads a lot like a high school paper. This book has a lot of heart and the author is obviously passionate about his subject matter but he should've had someone proofread it before it was published. Some of his stories might have been shocking when they happened (he told a kid their shoe was untied on April Fools'?? What a madman!) but they're mildly entertaining at best. He mentioned that Michael Eisner was visiting the park and that they weren't allowed to talk to him... and that was the extent of that story. And he had a whole section on gay people - how he saw a gay person once and now he's super tolerant of gay people. Not exactly PC. But it's a sweet book, an easy read, and a fun one at that.

After years of telling the stories of my experiences while working at Disneyland to friends, family members, co-workers, or anyone that would sit still long enough to hear them, I decided to write them down for posterity. In addition to my stories, I was able to dig up many photos to enhance the true tales, not to mention fill in some of the gaps in my memory.
