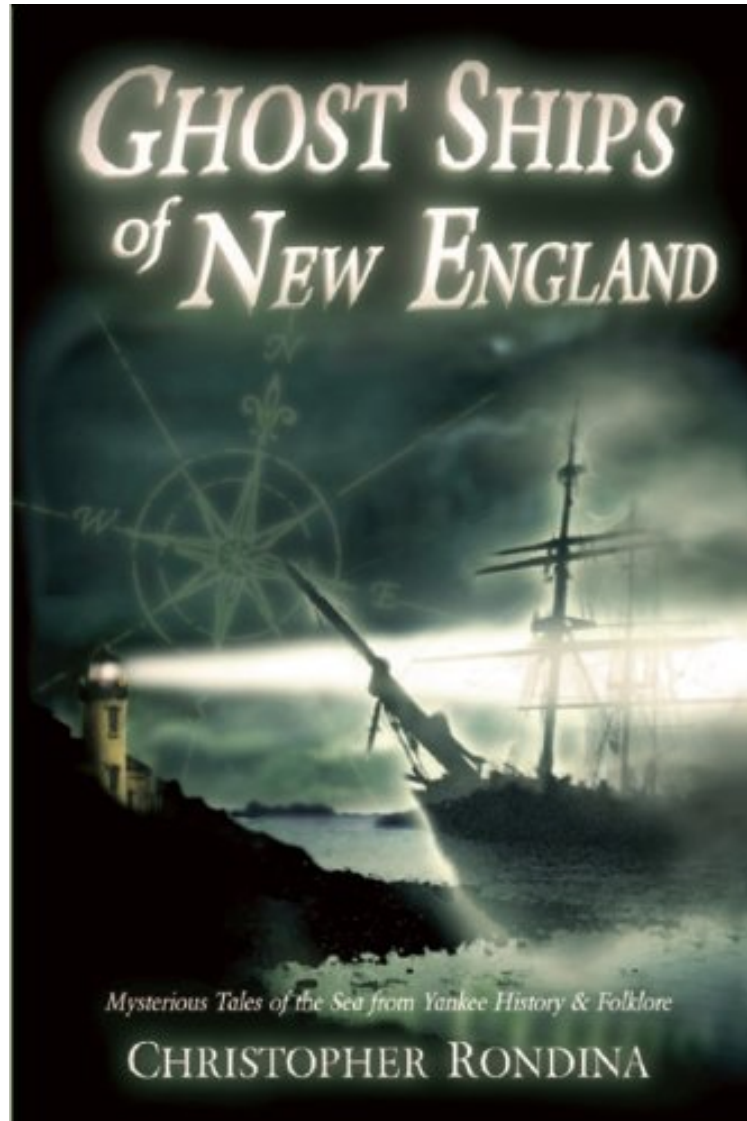

Especially with the recent release of the "Pirates of the Caribbean" movies, it was really interesting to hear of many stories which inspired the tales in those films. I had also been interested in the Mary Celeste and her quite mysterious story (even with all modern historical evidence, profilers, etc. they still can't reach a

conclusion on what definitively happened here), so it was great to see it here too. Christopher Rondina has a natural ability to tell a story and his obvious personal interest in the topic makes the book interesting, mysterious, thought-provoking - everything a good ghost story should! Overall, I really enjoyed the book; I could have done with a few more stories or a bit more written about each one (it's a short book, with about 125 pages, excluding references), so it'll take maybe an hour of leisurely reading and no more, so I just thought I'd mention that as it says 174 pages, but content-wise it's not quite that, plus it's fast to read.
