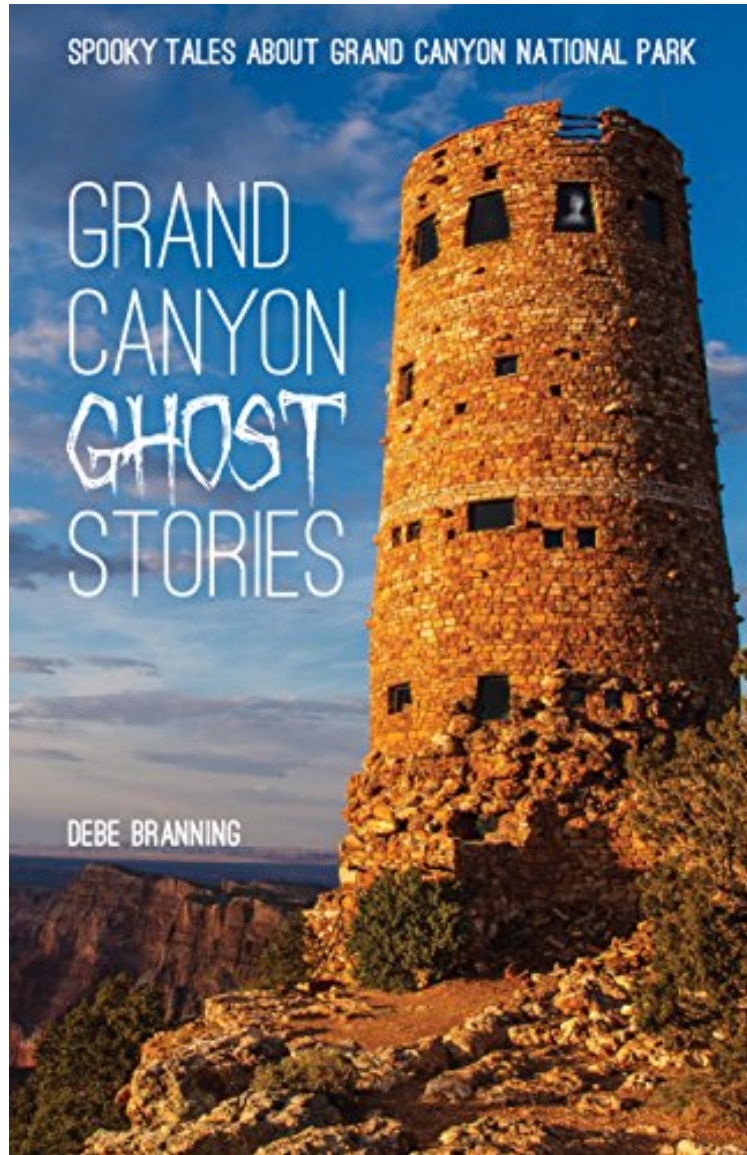

Not only is the writing terrible, Branning quoted park rangers without their permission (pg. 29 Tusayan Ruin's Bad Spirits), and has her facts wrong. On page 98, while mentioning Skeleton Point, Branning writes "embedded in the

aged flat sandstone are the skeletal footprints of mammal-like reptiles..." That layer of rock is limestone, and if there were fossils, one would find shells and other marine life. The chapter on the Hydes, the honeymooning river rafters, mentions Emery Kolb's daughter, Emily. The only problem? Kolb's daughter's name was EDITH. That is so easy to find out. Lazy, lazy. But the most egregiously offensive bit of "writing" in this book is the chapter called "The Legend of Bert Loper." Debe Branning...you committed an author's sin of plagiarism. Read a book called "Tales of the Grand Canyon" by Edna Evans (published 1985). Chapter 7, "Canyon Mysteries" has the same legend of Bert Loper...WORD FOR WORD. Debe Branning...how dare you?!
