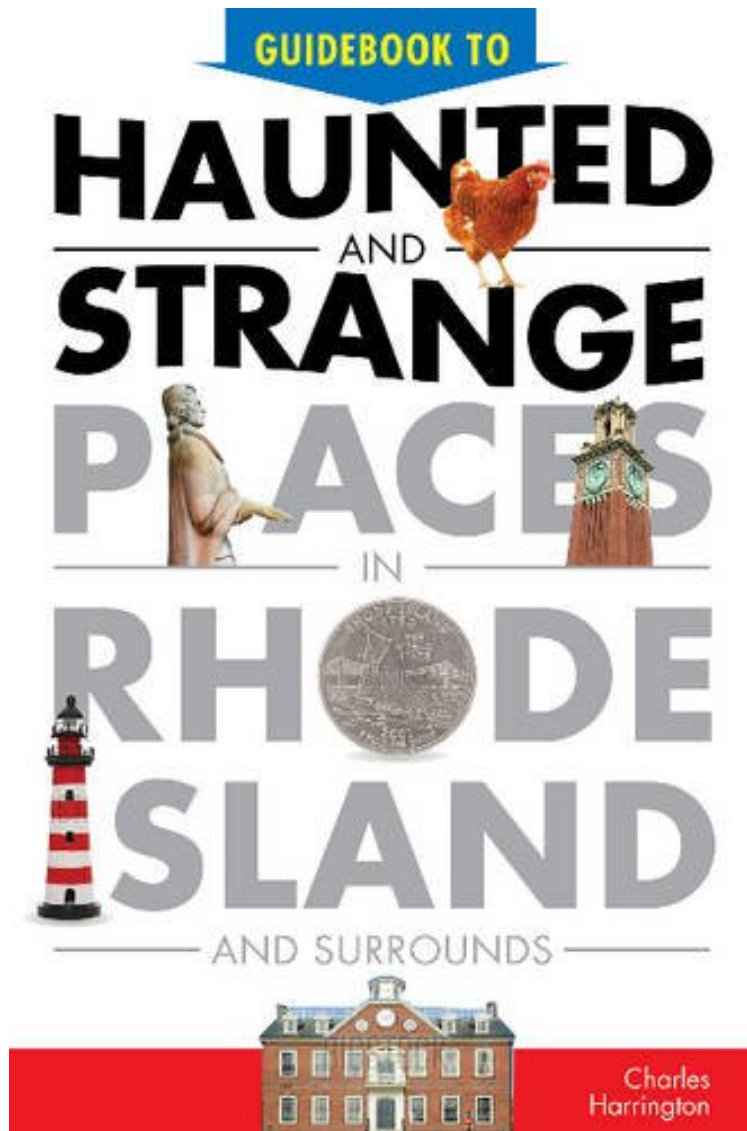

Lovecraft and twenty-seven areas around Providence. Next we proceed to Prudence Island, Newport, Jamestown, and four additional sites. All locations have a picture, a description of the site and the haunting story, and each section ends with a map of the area for you to locate each site. When visiting Rhode Island, here is a collection of 49 sites to check out if you enjoy haunting and other mysterious locations. BranningRhode Island might be a small state but Charles Harringtons new book, Haunted and Strange Places in Rhode Island and Surrounds (Schiffer Publishing 2016) is big in every way. Take a journey of the Ocean State through 14 self-guided walking and biking tours and learn tales of some of the lesser known haunted locations of Rhode Island.If you are a fan of H. P. Lovecraft, you wont want to miss the special walking tour that highlights locations found in his horror stories. Visit the Episcopal Cemetery on Benefit Street. St. Johns Church Cemetery is said to be the haunt of Edgar Allan Poe, Lovecraft and other ghosts.Take the road guide to the famous White Horse Tavern. Before literacy was more common shops advertised with simple images outside their doors. A horse mean drinks, and drinks were often associated with merriment and gossip. Today the White Horse Tavern offers tales of the macabre, great food and spirits, and ghost stories, too. Take a 3.5-mile stroll along the Cliff Walk and keep your eyes peeled for the legendary Ghost Ship.Travel to Prudence Island to see Sandy Point Lighthouse (one of the many light houses on the walking tour) and learn about the hurricane of 1938 when the lighthouse keeper and guests were washed out to sea. Do they return to haunt the shore line?This book offers nine maps to help you along the route and includes a historic backdrop for each location. The maps are large and easy to follow. What a great way to see Rhode Island in a more supernatural light!

Put on comfortable shoes or boots to journey through 14 self-guided walking and biking tours of the strange and haunted locations across some lesser-known regions of Rhode Island. Tales of mythical monsters, ghosts, and spirits from a murder or two may greet you as you explore Providence, Newport, Jamestown, and surrounding areas. Meet fabled half-deer, half-goat "doat," a demonic dog that has been scaring visitors for centuries, and ghosts that may be slightly more welcoming. Find out whether the Newport Tower is the true location of the lost Viking city of Norumbega, and visit the strange locations made famous by Rhode Island's favorite son of horror fiction: H. P. Lovecraft. Nine maps will guide you along your route and historical backgrounds provide the backdrop for the supernatural. To date, no one taking these tours has died at the hands of a mysterious lurking creature, so you should be fine...
