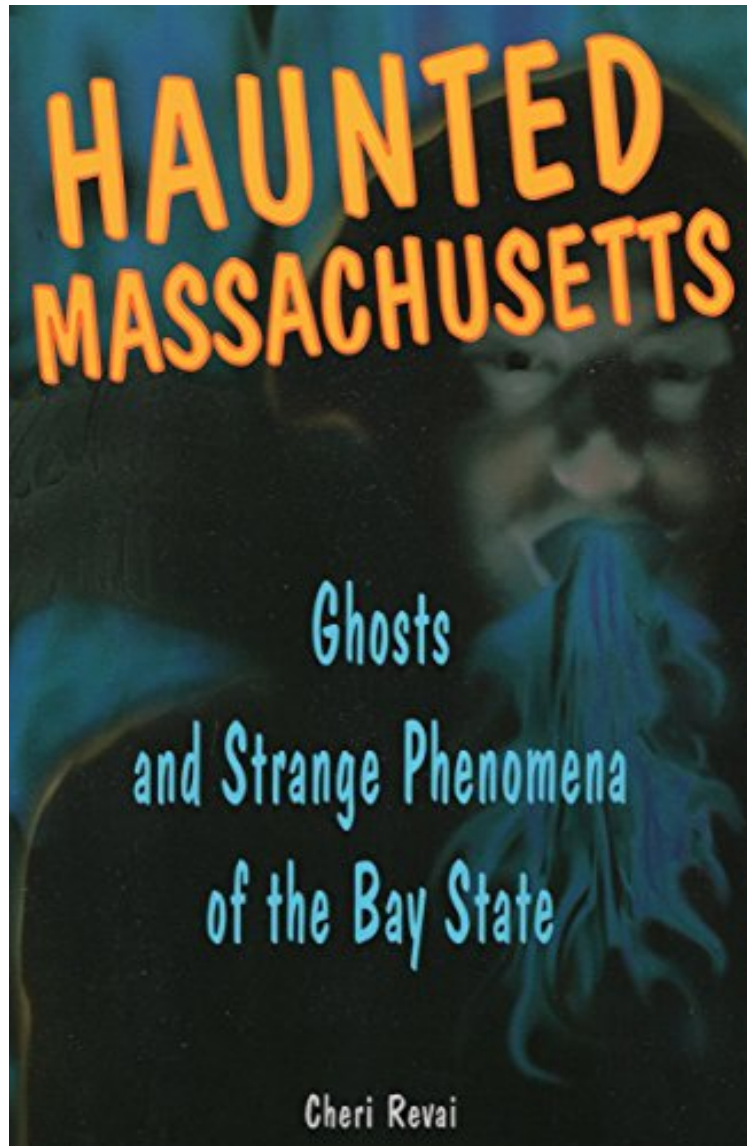

Haunted Northern New York series, I decided to pick up a copy of this book. I was rather disappointed. This volume, like most of the Stackpole series, gives merely an overview of "ghostly history" in the state of Massachusetts. The stories here have been told elsewhere. If you are looking for an introduction to the subject, or a gathering of Massachusetts legends all in one volume, you may enjoy this. However, I found them lacking in depth and even the good stories from history were rendered less than compelling. Really well told Massachusetts ghost stories are found elsewhere, but you'll have to do some looking. For classic historical tales I recommend the books of Robert Ellis Cahill, who lends personal elements to the tales presented with actual research and familiarity with the locations involved. Edward Lodi has several volumes of good stories collected in the Massachusetts area. They are a perfect mix of stories (some forgotten) dug up "from the archives" and stories told to him first or second-hand, by friends or neighbors. David J. Pitkin has written "Ghosts of The Northeast" and "New England Ghosts," which are packed full of well-written first hand accounts of the supernatural, most of which have been personally investigated. Then there's the classic "New England Ghost Files" which is a collection of truly unique and frightening tales told by the people who lived them.
