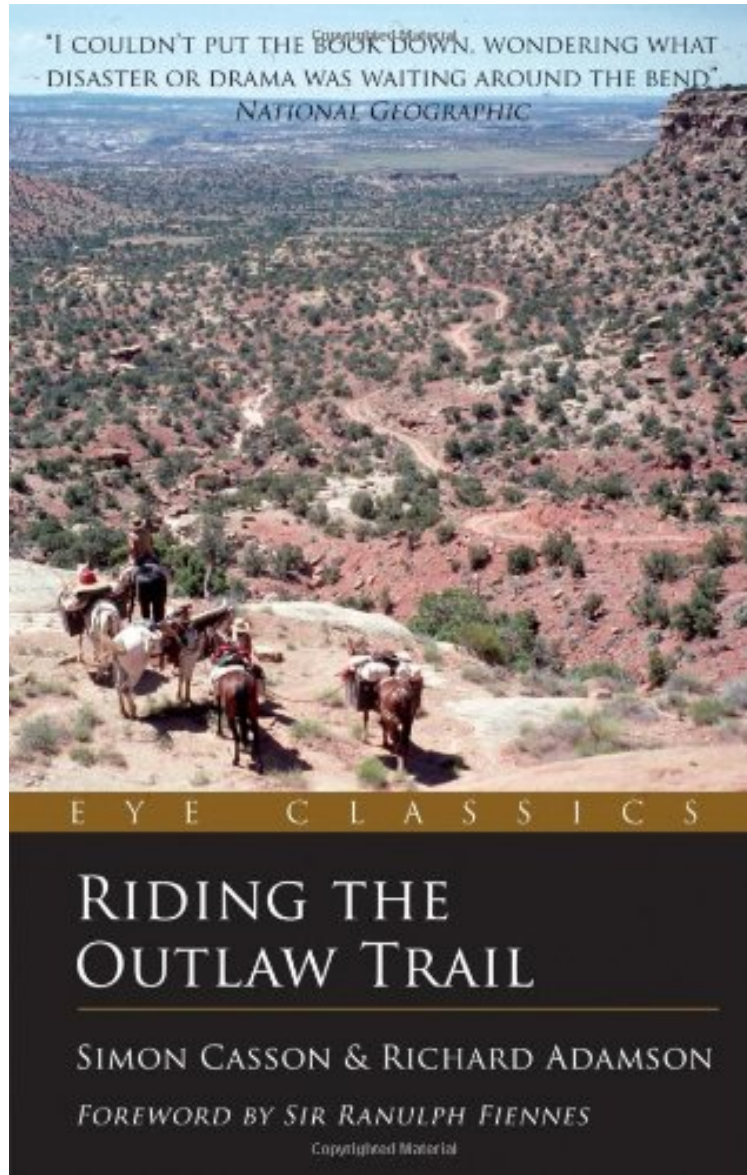

undertaking. I followed the route mile by mile in my DeLorme Atlases covering border to border. I found some of the trail descriptions/locations were not accurate, or if they were, there was much unnecessary zig zagging on the trail. The most confusing part was the approach to Alma, NM, when following the canyon names, roads, springs, things just didn't match up. Also, many state highway numbers were inaccurate as the trip progressed, particularly through Wyoming and Montana. To the reader who is not a student of the Outlaw Trail or the Wild Bunch, it is a fantastic read. To those of us intent on following the trail mile by mile, border to border, tracking it on maps, it is a bit lacking. Still, I would recommend it. As the forward and reader testimonials say, this book gives the reader an awareness of the hardships The Wild Bunch endured--and conquered--in their choice of professions.
