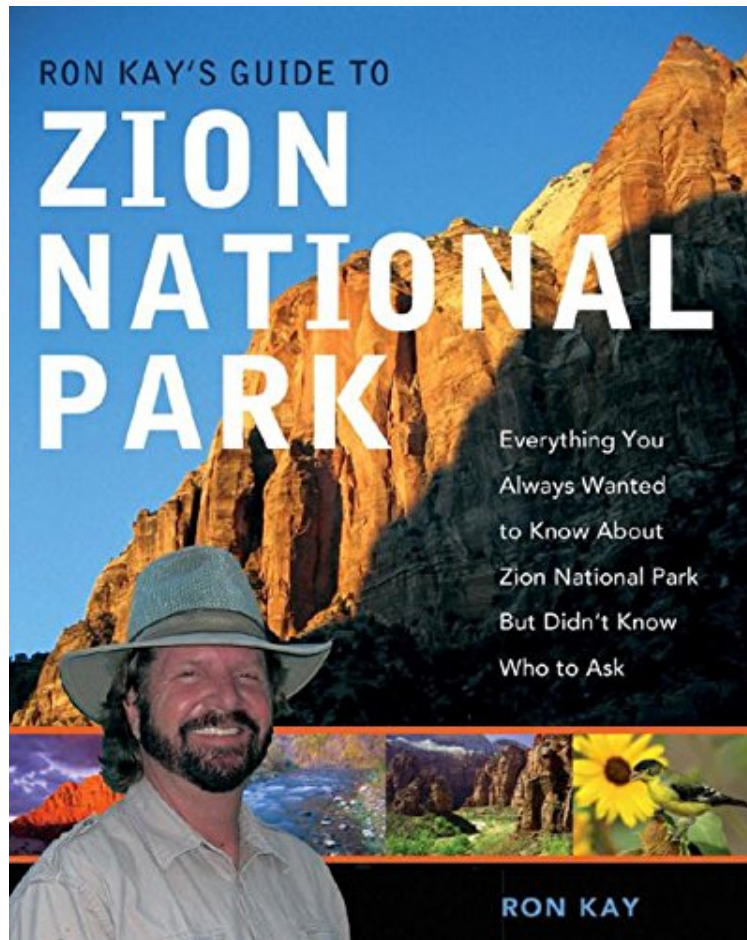

It's trail guides are accurate but pretty general. For example, we (60 year olds in mixed fitness) found the times stated as completion time for each trail to be very inaccurate...but

maybe we just walk fast. The trail guides are conveniently grouped as to how long you will be hiking; one day visit, three day visit, etc. The book includes descriptions of all sides of the park, not just the over populated south and east sides. Lots of good information about what to look for as far as landscape features, animals, and plants. This book also includes trails that other books, and our maps didn't mention, however we just marked those suggested trails on our maps, then used only the maps during our stay. This book is a good book to read first for an overview of the park.P.S. We loved Zion National Park, and the Narrows were absolutely the best part. There are some lovely formations on the way to Kanab.
