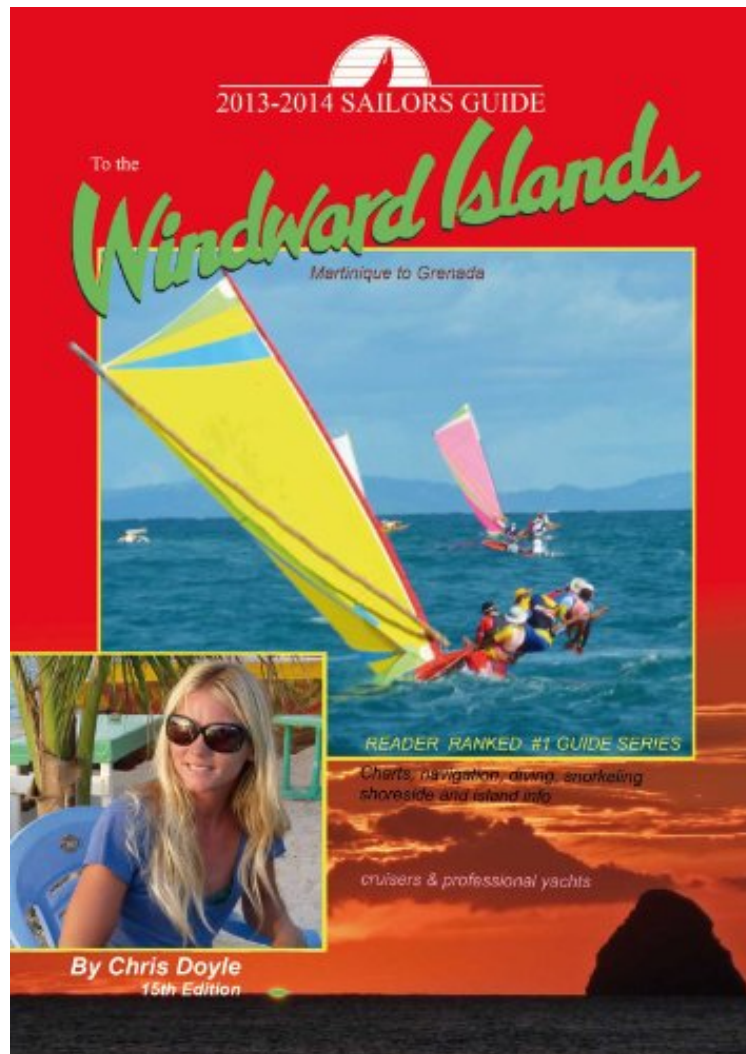


## Sailors Guide to the Windward Islands

I wouldn't go sailing anywhere without this guide if it was available. My only criticism is that on a recent sail from St. Vincent to Grenada

one of our favorite, most comfortable and beautiful anchorages was Isle de Ronde, a small island just north of Grenada, which the guide describes as an anchorage you'd only want to use, "in a pinch." The following night, in Dragon's Bay, a well known anchorage with mooring balls, the guide said nothing about it being rocky but it was our most uncomfortable night, with swells coming from 2 different directions. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. By JGCSAIL The guide did not come with an overview map which was disappointing because it helps with trip planning before you purchase charts. Very detailed in services and ashore items, but very limited in sailing information. Had many references to locations that were not shown on the page map. Many of the photo maps did not have a North direction arrow so it is hard to align the lay without an overview map. Lots of information on what to do, but would be nice to have more navigational info.
