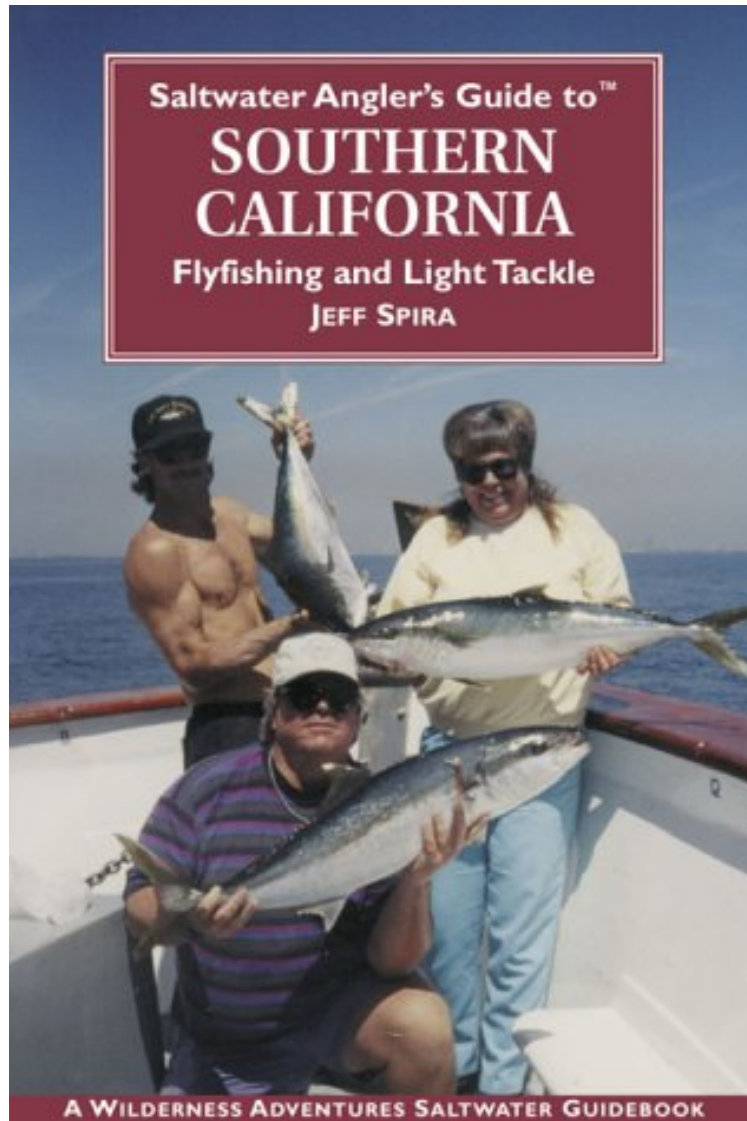

what do people catch around here? And how do they catch it? I got a fishing license, and read their the booklet that came with it, but that didn't help much. So I bought this book. In a nutshell, it tells me what fish people catch, in what kinds of conditions, at what times of the year, with what kind of equipment, in what manner. And it has a very detailed breakdown of the ENTIRE REGION, with plenty of personal experiences and stories mixed in. It explains a whole bunch of types of fishing, how to do them, with examples of gear to use, and explanations of why the gear was chosen. It has a great number of pages for all kinds of different fish, explaining how they think, how good they are to eat, where to find them, how to catch them, etc. One thing I've noticed is that there isn't a glossary. If it had one, I would rate it five stars, easy. He does define terms here and there, and there are a number of drawings and illustrations that help, but maybe I just don't know what a "spinner" is, to cite one example. I'm a little bit too much of a beginning sport-fisherman, but I expect to catch up pretty quickly. So I've identified the kind of fishing I want to do based on the geographic location that is near my house. So what I'm going to do next is take this book into a fishing tackle store, and use it to construct a shopping list, and get the right gear. The book shows me how to use it.
