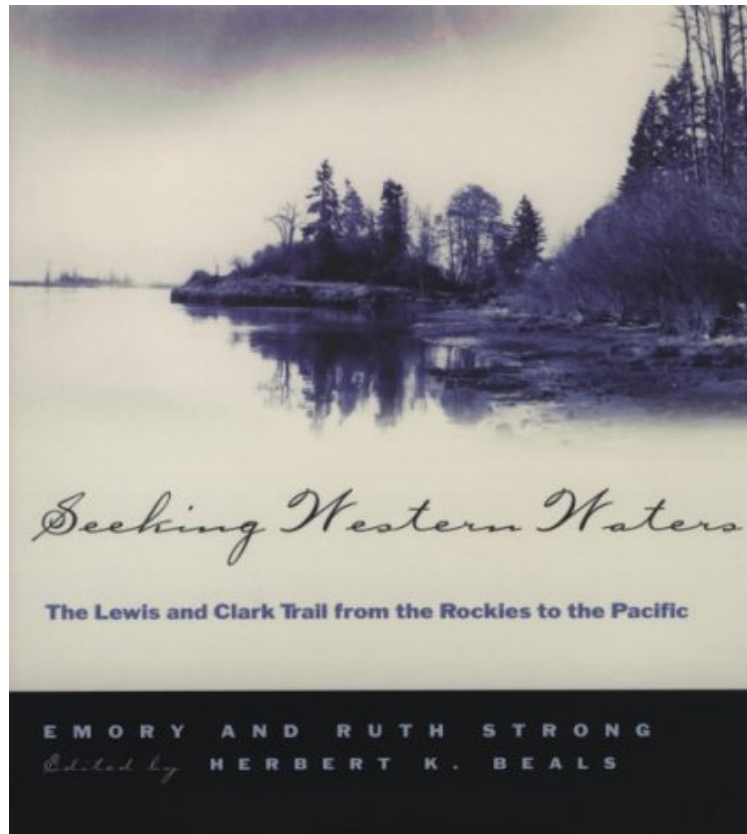

I first used it to discern the landscape for my thesis, which was about canoes of the inland Pacific Northwest. The book provided a map with Lewis Clark descriptions, often of the landscape, and a modern description. Since much of their journey was by canoe, it gave me a great picture not only about how the country looked, but how navigable it was by boat.I continued to use this book to discern landscapes and culture throughout their journey in my professional life as a geoarchaeologist, when my projects occurred on the Lewis and Clark Trail. It was always very helpful.It is incredibly easy to read and use, and is very reasonably priced.

The Corps of Discovery's exploration of the western United States between 1804 and 1806 resulted in a vast amount of information about the peoples, birds and other wildlife, and flora the expedition members encountered. This book pairs excerpts from the Reuben Gold Thwaites edition of the "Lewis and Clark" journals with images of landscapes and artefacts, allowing readers to better see and understand the explorers' journey from the Rockies to the Pacific Ocean.
