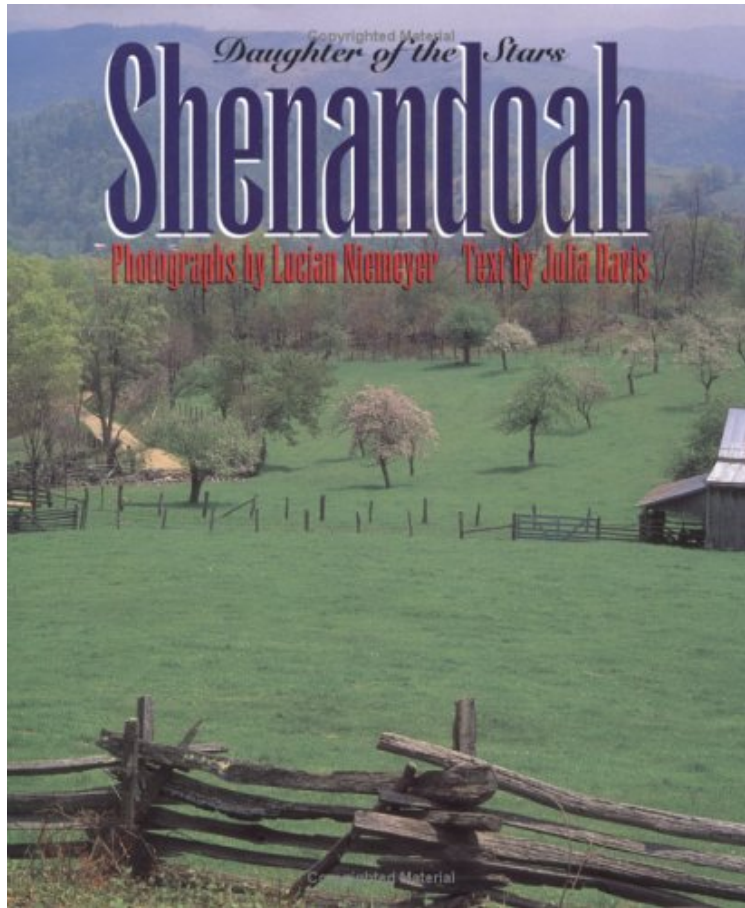

The Shenandoah Valley, a lush and elegant work of nature that rests between the Blue Ridge and Allegheny mountains, has been the scene of many important historic events. It is famous for Revolutionary and Civil War battles as well as its early Native American settlements and the activity of American pioneers. Photographer Niemeyer, a native of Germany who has published three other photography books about America (Chesapeake Country, Abbeville, 1990), captures the landscapes, shows us the architecture and historic sites, and introduces us to Shenandoah's residents in nearly 200 color photos.
