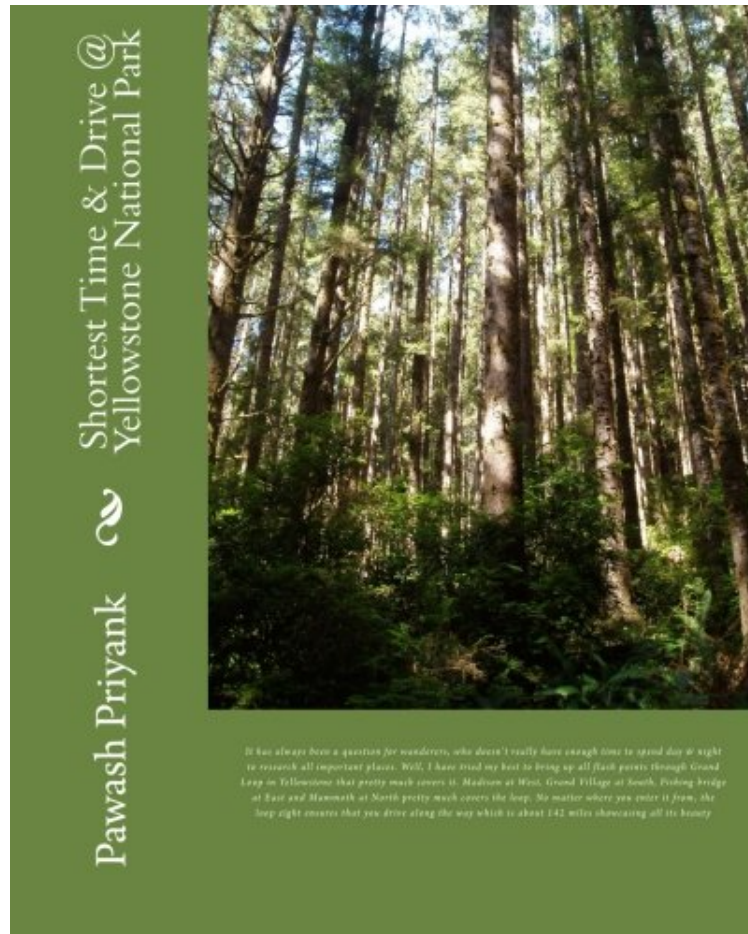

The only map in the book doesn't even have the no. of miles between Yellowstone sites let alone info on the average amount of time to drive between sites. (I have since discovered that this info can be found on the internet.) Further, the photos are amateurish at best, the descriptions are largely based on internet information rather than personal experience, and there is no

logical structure to the book whatsoever. Finally, the book is poorly written with no editing for sentence structure or grammar. Case in point is the first sentence of the book: "It has always been a question for wanderers, who doesn't (sic) really have enough time to spend day and night to research for all important places."
