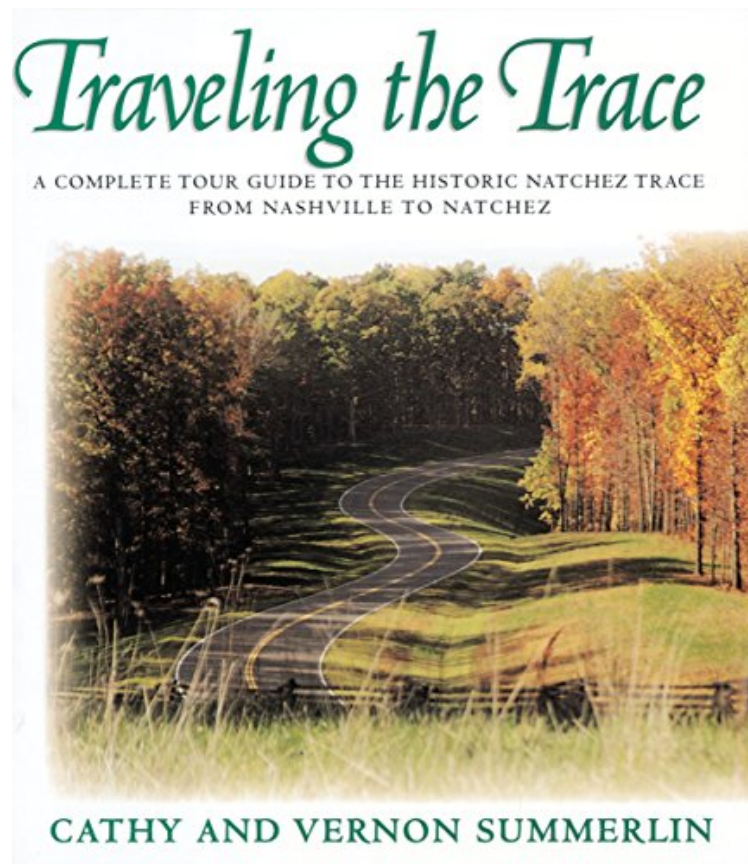

I expected it to go from Natchez to Nashville but it is just the opposite and that does not work with the mileage markers. Other than the cover all the photos are small and not of great quality; I expected much better. Maps - there are NONE. How does that work for a "tour guide?" There are no internet addresses or any email addresses for anything mentioned in the book: accommodations, attractions, restaurants, shopping, events or for additional information. I tried phone calls to several places and half of the numbers were no longer in service. This publication is just too far out of date to be of much use.
