book literally is a vanity production. A copy is printed when someone buys it. The content of this book is much better suited to being an online travel blog, if even that. There is far too much personal detail, for instance, about what food they chose to eat at Char, a steakhouse in Jackson, that really is inappropriate for an actual book about a trip to Natchez and Vicksburg.
