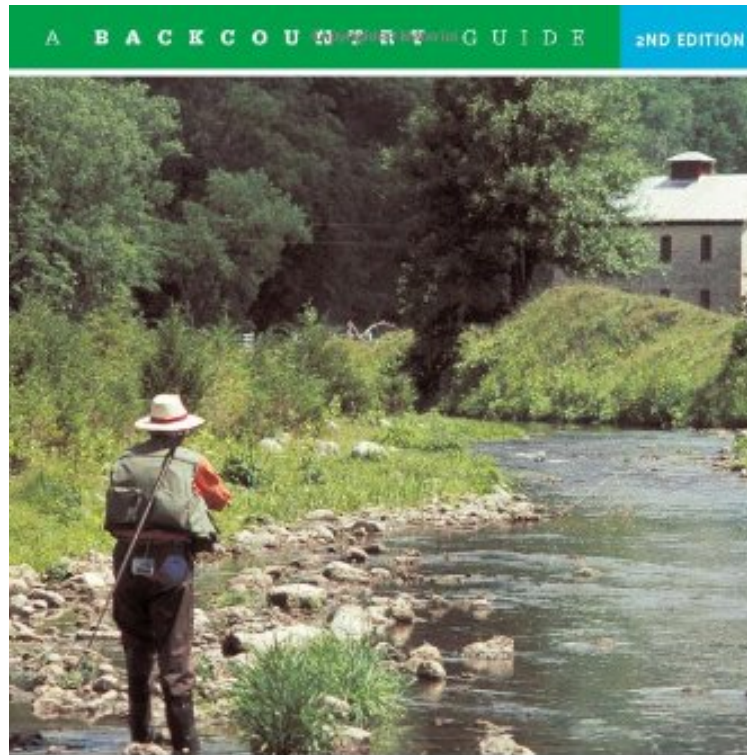

The real test will be when I visit the area this summer; An aside for those who purchase a Delorme atlas to help with locating specific access points is that probably due to time of publication the Delorme map pages cited by the authors, as associated with the locations they describe, due not match the current map book.
