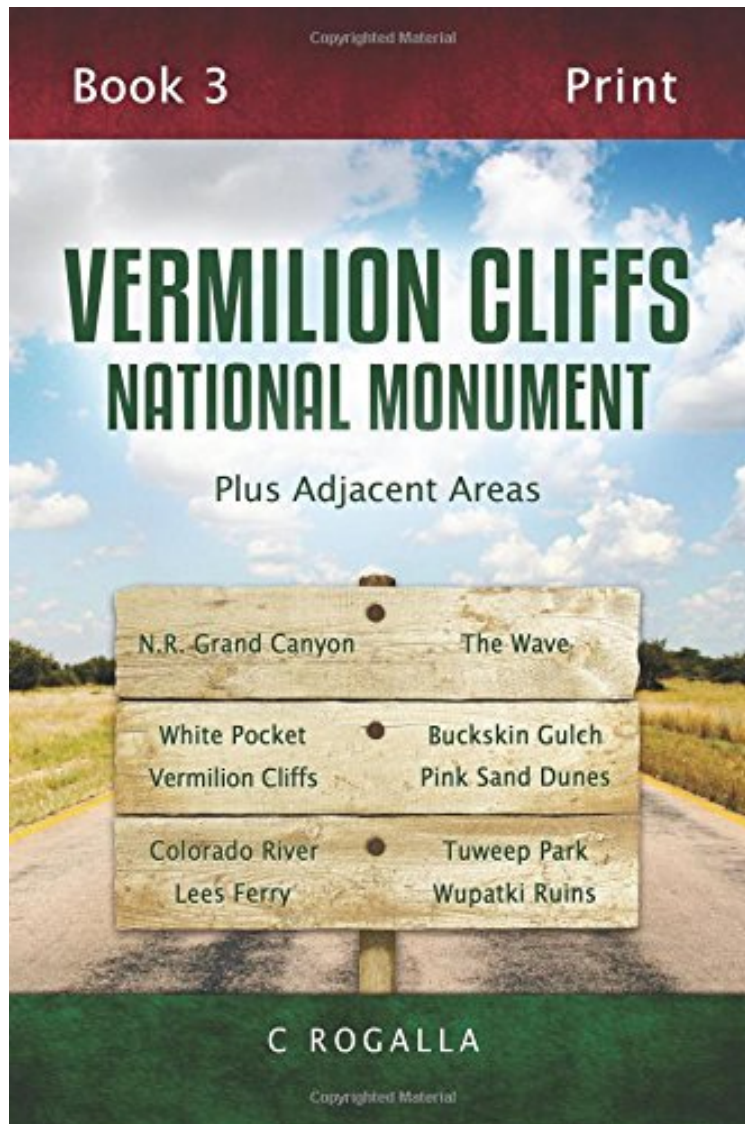

I have had this Kindle version for several months now and used it extensively for planning my trip next year. I found all information to be easily

referenced via the Table of Contents and internal Hyperlinks. This guidance has proven to be valuable and I am sure helped me avoid costly mistakes. The authors provide navigation mileage marks and GPS coordinates to help the curious traveler find many interesting but out of the way places that would otherwise be missed. Local histories, road and trail conditions are also described. External YouTube links provide additional views of trails and roads. It is important for the traveler to know where lodging, RV and dry campsites, and services are available and how to prepare before setting out. Information about sites that are closed or seasonally closed and others that require permits are provided I have had the Kindle version of this book for several months and used that to plan my future trip. Each of the tours describe terrain difficulty with recommendations for method of travel such as 2 or 4 wheel vehicle, bike, motorcycle or trekking only. Ample hazard warnings are included for personal safety. Must have phone numbers and contact resources where needed make reservations easy. After reading this book, my trip to south Rim Grand Canyon will be canceled in favor of staying in Kanab. Amazingly, the touring options in this area are endless. I'm looking forward to touring The Wave, Cottonwood Cove and White Pocket. The reason for giving four stars instead of five is that I'd like to have more information about the Page, AZ area.

Within Vermilion Cliffs National Monument there are exceptionally unique and seldom visited natural landscapes. The Wave is visited by tourist from around the world. As is the colorful and geological chaotic White Pockets. Buckskin slot canyon is the largest slot in the U.S. North Rim Grand Canyon is unique from the South Rim as it is not crowded. The western end, Tuweep, has the most dramatic view of the Colorado River. Kaibab Forest offers alternate views of the canyon that is really an extension of the national parks overlooks. Unlike Grand Canyon National Park trails, Kaibab Forest has a multitude of uncrowded hikes down to the river. Ancient Indian rock art (petroglyphs and pictographs) are abundant. The Arizona Strip is the most isolated area within continental U.S. almost void of human penetration. It has an area that is slightly larger than the state of Massachusetts. Within that vast area is Lees Ferry Colorado River crossing. It is the history of this area from Mormon pioneers to gold seekers. Our book is a combination of driving, hiking, mountain-biking and other tours such as rafting and horseback riding. There are suggestions of what to see and do for each tour. Mile-By-Mile Location - Your exact location is known by using a meticulous identification of MPs (posts along the road indicating mileage) located at each mile (1.6 km) on every improved road. Where those MPs are not available, we use actual miles from a designated reference point. Where applicable, Global Positioning data (GPS) is supplied to complement walking tours in remote areas. Using this collection of information, you will always know your exact location. We are sure this book will make your vacation more memorable and successful.
