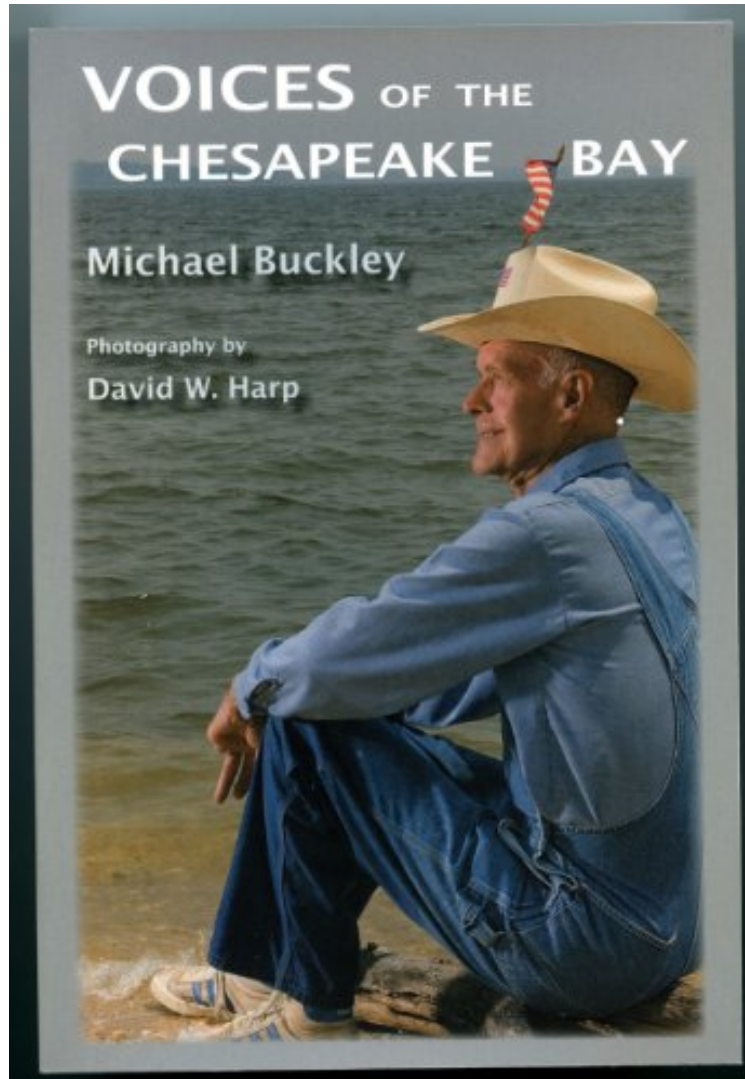

The show itself is an informative and often surprising look at the history, the culture and the science of the national treasure that is the Chesapeake Bay. The author faced a formidable challenge in taking what was originally a soundscape in which narrative was complemented by music and the sounds of nature. The book does the original series justice and introduces to the reader to a wide array of figures who make --and have made-- the Bay the

wonder that it is. Fisherfolk, Native Americans, dinosaur hunters, duck decoy artisans, oysterman, musicians and environmental scientists. Each one is a refreshing and informative voice that adds another facet to the complexity of humanity's relationships with the landscape that we inhabit. Michael Buckley beautifully captures individual voices, editing what were lengthier interviews into rich and articulate core messages. This is the kind of book one can plow through without attention to the passage of time or, with the individual interviews neatly edited, pick up and enjoy with short periods of reading. As a former resident of the area Michael Buckley writes about, I am able to hear the truth in this book's message and the inviting reality of the interviewee's voices. In giving voice to a national environmental treasure, Michael Buckley inspires a hunger to visit the places he writes about. Most are accessible, if a bit out of the way. Most important of all, the author reminds us that conserving special environments like the Chesapeake Bay is mandated by our collective history; our experience is sculpted by--and, in turn, sculpts-- sacred places that connects us to the past and to the wide world around us. I could not recommend this book more enthusiastically!

Now host Michael Buckley brings us a fascinating collection of over 50 of these interviews in written form, providing the reader with glimpses into Chesapeake Bay life from a variety of diverse perspectives.
